



Dunes CDD Utility Customer Notice (October 8, 2024)

Preparations – Hurricane Milton

The District requests that you voluntarily conserve potable water usage during and immediately after the storm to minimize mechanical and electrical demands on the District's water production, treatment, and storage facilities. Water conservation activities practiced during and after the storm also minimize the likelihood of sanitary sewer collection system and pumping station overflows that typically occur during storm events due to widespread power losses that disrupt power to remote pumping facilities. Should you fill your tub or other water receptacle for storing water as a preparatory activity, please consider using the water for alternate purposes to eliminate or delay the rate of return of this flow volume to the collection system.

The District's water supply wells and both water and wastewater treatment plants are equipped with auxiliary power generators that provide uninterrupted power to plant equipment should loss of normal FPL power occur.

In the unlikely event that impacts from the storm disrupts the District's capability to reliably supply and distribute potable water, the District shall issue further instructions to all customers via press release, website posting and other available modes of communication.

The District typically disables the reclaimed irrigation pumping system as a preemptive hurricane preparedness measure to minimize reclaimed system trouble calls to focus on critical potable water and wastewater collection system needs. District will assess operational status of all systems after storm and will restore residential irrigation service typically within a day or two.
